

# Las Vegas ConExpo breaks the records

The 2008 ConExpo-Con/Agg drew record crowds and generated a record number of enquiries for Tadano cranes.

The event is held every three years in Las Vegas, Nevada, and is North America's largest construction equipment exhibition. This year it was held 11-15 March. Official attendance figures show that there were 144,600 registered attendees from around the world, including 28,000 visitors from more than 130 overseas countries. This broke the record of 125,000 attendees that came in 2005. It also makes it the largest trade show of any industry held in North America in 2008.

Anticipating huge interest, Tadano increased its display space this year to show 11 cranes – more than ever before at a US exhibition – as well as an ATF cab simulator. The extra investment was clearly worth well, with a hugely positive response. Over the five days there was a constant stream of interested visitors as well as current customers and end-users.

Attracting the most interest were the Tadano



Faun ATF 220G-5 all terrain and the TM-35100 Tadano boom truck. The ATF 220G-5 has been available in North America for some months but it had never been displayed at at a major trade fair in the US before. The TM-35100 was making its public debut at Conexpo.

Although these machines drew the most interest at the booth, the entire product line drew a tremendous response and an unprecedented number of enquiries. The Tadano stand featured 11 cranes while the booth was staffed by a dedicated and enthusiastic team, extending hospitality and information to all visitors.

#### SWEDEN

Swedish rental company Holmströms Kranar AB, founded in 1980, operates a fleet of 10 cranes, mainly serving the construction industry. Four of its cranes are from Tadano or Tadano Faun. Just last November, it took delivery of a GR-300EX, followed in early 2008 by its first new ATF all terrain, an ATF 90G-4. This was also the first unit of this model to be delivered in Europe with the new telescopic hydraulic luffing jib introduced at the 2007 Bauma Fair. #### NORWAY

The Norway contingent was the largest, with 12 participants from Norwegian crane hire companies. While some customers in Norway already run ATF cranes in their fleets, others are more familiar with Tadano rough terrain cranes which, after years of positive experiences with them, has led to increasingly strong interest in the all terrain product line.

The company has a fleet of 12 cranes, and 10 of them are from Tadano Faun.



# Crane of the Year recognition for ATs

Tadano Faun's ATF 360G-6 and 220G-5 models have both been voted Crane of the Year in their class by the readers of German publication Kran Magazin.

Three other Faun all terrains - the ATF 40G-2, the ATF 65G-4 and the ATF90G-4 - were voted second in their class, while the ATF 50G-3 came third in the same class as the 65G-4.

No other manufacturer won as many awards in the competition as Tadano Faun.

The Crane of the Year competition is held every three years, with voting taking

place some months after the Munich Bauma Fair to give crane owners and operators time to consider the new machines always introduced at that event.

There were six categories for telescopic mobile cranes: up to 40-tonne capacity, up to 110-tonne, up to 220-tonne, up to 400tonne and over 400-tonne capacity. The winners were announced in March at the ConExpo Fair in Las Vegas, USA.

## ATF 40G-2 shipments start



Deliveries of the new ATF 40G-2 are now happening at full pace, with more than 30 units shipped to customers across Europe already. The 40-tonne all terrain was launched at the Bauma Fair in Germany last year.

One of the first units was bought by German company Kranverleih Reichert, located near Frankfurt. Managing director

Werner Reichert, together with his young son Tobias, visited the factory in Lauf to collect the crane. Reichert operates only Tadano Faun all terrains and now has six units, with the biggest being an ATF 160G-5. A seventh will arrive this month in the shape of a new ATF 65G-4.

German experts voted the Tadano Faun ATF 360G-6 as the best telescopic mobile crane in the 221to 400-tonne category, while the ATF 220G-5 was chosen in the 111- to 220-tonne category.

Tadano America Corporation has moved to new headquarters. Still in the city of Houston, Texas, the new facility occupies a 46,000 square foot (4,300 square metre) site.

New facilities include a mounting plant for boom trucks, a technical training centre and an exhibition room for demonstrations. Continental Ltd is the exclusive distributor for Tadano mobile cranes in Bangladesh. The company was established in 1976 and began representing Tadano in 1982. The company is owned by Mr Shafiqul Islam, who is the President and CEO. He has a staff of 26 employees and a network of 15 sub-agents, as well as its own aftersales service facility.

Continental also sells other types of construction and industrial machinery, such as Komatsu excavators and TCM forklifts. When it comes to cranes, it is the rough terrain type that most customers in Bangladesh want, although Continental has also sold Tadano truck cranes in the past.

Bangladesh is not a huge market for cranes, with the whole country typically buying in the region of 10 new cranes each year and 20 used ones. However, it is a market that is growing and, thanks to Continental, Tadano maintains a very strong market-leading position. "There is a lot of construction going on now," Mr Shafiqul Islam says. Continental also supplies cranes to gas production fields, fertilizer factories and, through the Bangladesh

Army, to the United Nations peacekeeping forces, as reported in the last issue of Tadano Global News.

With demand for cranes growing, Continental is gearing up for expansion.

"We are now preparing for a much bigger market in the coming years," says Mr Shafiqul Islam. "We are getting ready."
